



Douglas-fir is monoecious; male "flower" is a pollen cone (strobilus). These are pinkish and pendulous.



The female 'flowering' cone is upright and bright pink.



'Fruit' is a woody cone with seeds located between the scales. The seed cone is pendulous, 2-4 four inches long; marked by three -pointed bracts.



Needles held singly on the stem; 1 to 1.5 inches long, with a somewhat blunt tip. Medium green, with two white stripes on lower surface. Terminal bud light brown, imbricate and pointed.



Form is pyramidal. Height: 50 to 80 feet
