



Small, yellow-green flowers, held in cymes. Each flower has 4 sepals, 4 petals, 4 stamens and a central stigma.



The fruit is a four-lobed, red capsule that splits open to reveal orange arils, each surrounding a single seed. The capsule in the photo did not develop all 4 lobes.



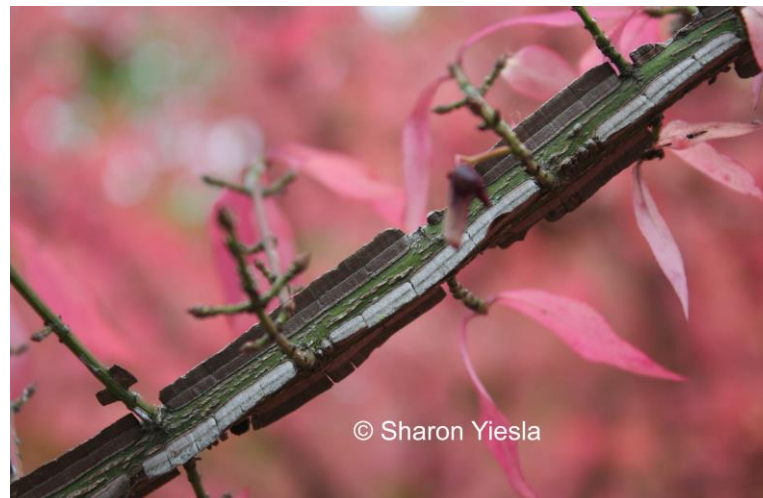
The opposite leaves are simple with finely toothed margins. Petioles are very short.



The imbricate buds are ovoid with 5 to 6 scales. Leaf scars are whitish.



Younger stems are green, with 2 to 4 corky wings.
