



The solitary white flowers are perfect and have four petals. Flowering occurs late spring to early summer.



Black jetbead produces groups of up to four bead-like drupes that mature from green to reddish-brown (left) to black (right). The drupes are subtended by four persistent sepals.



The brownish-green, imbricate buds are slightly stalked and diverge from the stem.



The opposite leaves are simple with doubly-toothed margins. The veins are deeply impressed.
