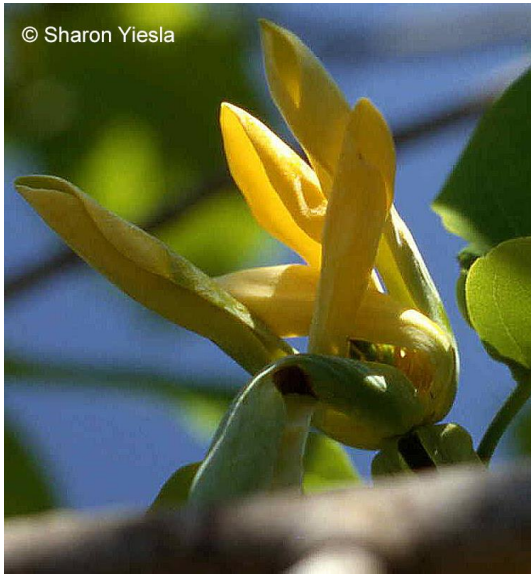




*Magnolia acuminata*

Cucumbertree Magnolia (page 1 of 2)

The [solitary](#) flowers are [perfect](#). This magnolia flowers later than other species and the flowers are a mix of yellow and green. The flower has 6 [tepals](#). Inside the flower is a ring of many flat [stamens](#) surrounding a column of numerous [pistils](#).

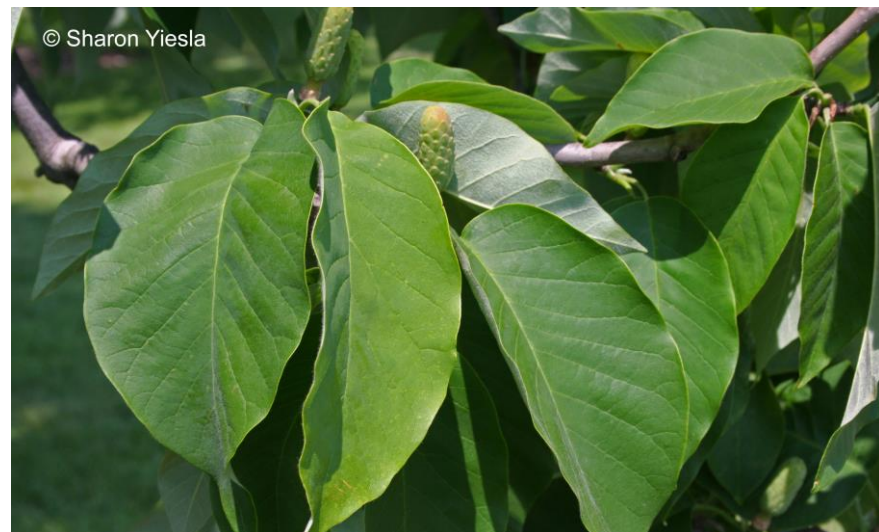


Fruit is an [aggregate](#) of [follicles](#), resembling a small cucumber when immature (left). It ripens to a rosy pink color and measures up to 3 inches long (right).



Leaves are [simple](#) and [alternate](#); ovate with [entire margins](#). They are up to 10 inches long.

The terminal bud is whitish and covered with silky hairs; stems are stout and dotted with [lenticels](#). [Stipule](#) scars encircle the stem (arrow).

Pyramidal when young becoming more oval with maturity. Height: 60 to 80 feet.



Mature bark is thin and somewhat flaky.



Fall color is yellow
